Four Athletes Chosen for Appalachian Athletics Hall of Fame

The most successful baseball hitter in school history; a first-team all-American; and two All-Conference football selections comprise the 2005 class of the Appalachian Athletics Hall of Fame.

Randy Ingle (baseball 1977-79) is the all-time leader in career batting average (min. 200 AB) at .404. He batted an Appalachian and SoCon record .477 in 1979 en route to all-SoCon, SoCon Player of the Year, all-region and first-team all-American honors. He played professionally in the Atlanta Braves farm system and has been a manager in the Braves farm system for many years.

Jim Conger (football 1956-59) was a four-year starter at Appalachian who never missed a game in his college career. He was all-North State Conference for two years and was a Williamson all-American nominee starting in 39 of his 40 college games. He played full time on offense, defense and special teams his entire career.

Rico Mack (football 1989–92) was first-team all-American and SoCon Defensive Player of the Year in 1991. He was named third-team all-American in 1989. In 1991 he led the Mountaineers to their third SoCon title and a berth in the NCAA-I-AA playoffs. He played professionally for the Pittsburg Steelers in 1994.

Richard Tickle (football 1961-64) won All-Carolinas Conference plaudits as a senior in 1964. He was one of three linebackers chosen for Appalachian's 75th Anniversary Team in 2003. He anchored a defense that surrendered a school-low 783 yards in 1963 (87 yards per game).

The Hall of Fame breakfast begins at 9 a.m. on Sept. 17 at the Broyhill Inn and Conference Center prior to Appalachian's 2005 football home opener against Coastal Carolina. Tickets are \$12. Send a check to the Former Athletes Association, Owens Field House, Boone, NC 28608, no later than Aug. 31.

Coach Jerry Moore's Mountaineers have been looking forward to 2005 football since ending the last year's season with bitter losses against UT-Chattanooga and Western Carolina. The Mountaineers are facing one of their toughest schedules since 1992 when they opened against Wake Forest and NC State. The Mountaineers open at the alwaystough Eastern Kentucky, followed by a trip to the University of Kansas. They return to play Coastal Carolina at home. The Mountaineers travel to The Citadel before taking a break on Oct. 1. They continue their SoCon play followed by a road trip to LSU on Nov. 5. The Mountaineers finish their regular season with Western Carolina and Elon.

The offensive line will be anchored by center Scott Suttle, guards Kerry Brown and Jeremy Robertson, along with tackles Grant Oliver and Matt Isenhour. Daniel Bettis returns at tight end with support from Nic Cardwell. Zack Johnson, Hans Batichon and Dexter Jackson lead a stable of wide receivers. Kevin Richardson will be at running back and Trey Elder gives strong support as backup quarterback. John Holt, Kyle Knox, Jeff Corning, Cory Rycroft and Jonathan Bieschke bring depth to the offensive line.

On defense, the Mountaineers will count on Marques Murrell, Jason Hunter and Marcial Medina at end. Omarr Byrom and Joe Suiter hold down the tackles with the Orlebar brothers giving strong support. Top contenders at linebacker are Zodd Kelly, Charles King and

Monte Smith. Brad West, Cam Speer and Michael King bring strong support. Jeremy Wiggins will be at nickle, Dominick Dingle and Jerome Touchstone at the corners and Corey Lynch at safety. Billy Riddle, Justin Woazeah, Michael Clarke and Seth Breitenstein bring depth to the defensive backfield.

Yosef expects the Mountaineers to be a contender for the SoCon Championship again this year.
